


Investment in 2014

AMRC members fund over **a third** of publicly funded medical research nationally




Charities invested **£111m** in capital projects in the UK



Medical research is the UK's most popular cause. **7.6m people** donate in a typical month


Funding across the research pipeline

A taste of research impact*

We fund great research: research funded by charities attracts further funding from other funders and influences policy and practice



- 31% Charity
- 29% Global
- 21% Research Councils
- 17% NIHR/NHS



314 influences on policy and practice occurred between 2012-14 from charity funded research

- research funded by charities is **cited in guidance**
- people funded by charities provide **expert advice to government**
- research findings are used to **influence training of practitioners or researchers**
